- 2. Author named in parentheses If a signal phrase does not name the author, put the author’s last name in parentheses along with the page number. Use no punctuation between the name and the page number.

- **35. Short work from a Web site** Short works include articles, poems, and other documents that are not book length or that appear as internal pages on a Web site.

- **3. Author unknown** Either use the complete title in a signal phrase or use a short form of the title in parentheses. Titles of books are italicized; titles of articles are put in quotation marks.

TIP: Before assuming that a Web source has no author, do some detective work. Often the author's name is available but is not easy to find. For example, it may appear at the end of the page, in tiny print. Or it may appear on another page of the site, such as the home page.

NOTE: If a source has no author and is sponsored by a corporation or government agency, name the corporation or agency as the author (see [items 8](#) and [17](#)).

Works Cited

Hints for formatting a works cited page:

1. Authors' names are listed last name, first name.
2. Entries are alphabetical by first author's last name. *If no last name, alphabetically by title of article/work.
3. Title is centered; all entries are left-aligned. Works cited page is a new page at the end of the document.
4. Everything is double-spaced; no extra space between entries.
5. First line of all entries is left-aligned. All subsequent lines of each entry are indented in one inch. Just "tab" won't work; "ctrl-tab" is required.

The basic format for the TED videos, and an example, is as follows: (*example not alpha*)

Author's Name. "Title of Image or Video." Media Type

Text. *Name of Website*. Name of Website's Publisher,
date of posting. Medium. Date retrieved.
